SUMMARY STATEMENT OF DEFICIENCIES  
(FINDINGS PRECEDED BY TAGS AND REGULATORY IDENTIFYING INFORMATION)

**0000 - INITIAL COMMENTS**

An unannounced licensure complaint survey, CCR#2017014259, was conducted on 2/16/18, at All Women's Clinic, License # 865. The allegation was not substantiated. The facility had an associated deficiency at the time of the investigation.

**0500 - Incident Reporting-2nd Trimester - 59A-9.029, FAC**

Based on record review and interview, the facility failed to report an incident that resulted in serious injury to a patient, in writing, to the agency (Agency for Health Care Administration) within 10 days after the incident occurred, for 1 of 3 Patients. (Patient #1).

The findings included:

Review of Patient #1's record reveals that on \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ she was seen in the facility for a 2 day 2nd trimester abortion procedure, an \_\_\_\_\_ performed on \_\_\_\_\_ reveals the gestational age was "20 weeks". A note documented by the Physician on \_\_\_\_\_ at 10:30 AM reveals that "4 Luminaria" (inserted on \_\_\_\_\_) were removed", and at 10:35 AM, Patient #1 "aborted". A 2nd note documented by the Physician on \_\_\_\_\_ reveals "procedure immediately d/c (discontinued), after bowel identified, hospitalization and \_\_\_\_\_ initiated". During interview with the Physician on \_\_\_\_\_ at approximately 1:00 PM, he confirms that "he immediately recognized perforation of the \_\_\_\_\_, saw Patient # 1's bowel, and possible \_\_\_\_\_ damage, at the end of the abortion procedure on \_\_\_\_\_. During further interview with the Physician, he explains he immediately contacted 911 (emergency medical services), accompanied Patient #1 to the hospital, and Patient #1 was evaluated in the emergency room. The Physician also states he assisted the hospital surgeon by repairing Patient # 1's uterine perforation, and the hospital surgeon resected Patient # 1's bowel. During the interview, the Physician explains that "Patient #1 received a \_\_\_\_\_, due to the perforation". Surveyor requested a log of patient incident reports, and the Physician explains that he maintains a log of patient incidents related to abortion procedures on a bi-annual basis, during the interview. Review of the log dated 1/1/17--12/31/17 reveals information regarding "failed abortion procedures or complications"; however the specific dates, names of patients, and details of incidents was not recorded. Additional review of the log from 1/1/17-12/31/17 reveals one of the 6 entries documented on the log was "uterine perforation one (1) admitted to ... (name of hospital)". Additional interview with the Physician on 2/16/18 reveals the incident.
